

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

A two-story rectangle, stucco over brick building, with large matching double stairways leading to the main entrance on the second floor. Stairs are concrete over brick, with granite siding. Beneath and between the stairs is a barrel vaulted entrance into the basement. Outside and inside of the passageway are windows. The stairs mask the entire lower front of the building. The other sides of lower level are simulated building blocks pierced with windows set up in five pairs divided by piers. Instead of the central pair of windows on the sides, there is a side door with a divided transom window above it. Upper part of the door is glass divided into six panes.


The upper, or main, floor is separated from the lower by a stuccoed course of brick.

The walls of the story are flat, unembellished stucco. The front area contains a double wooden door flanked by a pair of rectangular windows, one pair to a side. The door has a transom above it which is divided into four parts, the lower part of which opens inward. The door and windows are topped by cornices.

The sides of the upper story are divided into five equal parts by pilasters extending from the piers below. Between the pilasters are matched pairs of rectangular windows, each with its own cornice which are identical to the other cornices.

The pilasters terminate in a wide strip of crown molding with no embellishments. Between the molding and the flat roof is a small area of dent on the underside of the slight eave, as well as on the upper most part of the walls.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Significant as one of the few examples of Victorian commercial architecture in the Mount Pleasant area and politically significant as county seat for Berkeley from 1884 to 1898.

This building was built in 1884 in the then village of Mount Pleasant to be the Court House of Berkeley County, at the time of the division of Berkeley into Charleston and Berkeley Counties. The building was used as the Court House until 1898 when Mount Pleasant was made part of Charleston County. In the years that followed, it was used by both the Lutherans and the Baptists as a church. In 1968, it passed into the hands of the present owner.


