



DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two, 10 inch gun, coastal defense battery, constructed 1906-1909, was built to protect Charleston harbor. The battery, approximately 326 feet long and 84 feet wide, consists of two sections: The glacis and the armament complex. The glacis, a relatively smooth, slightly sloping area on the sides and front of the battery, protects the armament complex from bombardment. The armament complex consists of two recessed disappearing gun platforms, the loading platforms, ammunition hoists (one per gun), an observation post and various staircases or ramps for access.

The front of ocean side of the battery is approximately ten feet high. The front curves to the rear of the structure. This section (rear), consists of 22 metal posts which support the rear of the loading platform. Behind the posts are doors leading to the powder, shot, and machinery rooms inside the battery. Ramps are of concrete.

INTERIOR:

Walls and ceilings are of concrete. All machinery and guns were removed in 1947 at the decommissioning of the battery. Rooms can be entered from ground level. Spiral staircases within concrete body lead to upper levels of battery.

SURROUNDINGS:

Battery Thomson lies to the immediate north of Sullivan's Island school and is one of a series of batteries built in the early 20th Century. A tenth of a mile to the west is the Coast Guard Historic District (National Register). The Town of Sullivan's Island plans to use the rooms in Battery Thomsom as a public library.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Battery Thomson, constructed 1906-1909 by Captain G.P. Howell, is one of a series of batteries extending from Fort Moultrie on the west to the eastern end of Sullivan's Island. Charleston harbor has always had some form of fixed harbor defense beginning with Fort Johnson in 1708 and culminating with the construction of these batteries in the fortification of Sullivan's Island at the mouth of Charleston harbor.

MILITARY:

Battery Thomson was established in order to command the entrance to the Charleston harbor jetties. The battery still maintains the appearance of a typical coastal defense battery of the early 20th Century. It was constructed following the recommendations of the Endicott Board under the Cleveland Administration (1886).

ENGINEERING:

The four, ten inch guns were breech loading rifled artillery on recessed, disappearing platforms. At the time of their construction, these guns, with their electrically controlled fire and alignment, were superior to larger guns on battleships. (The location of ships could be plotted from several stationary points on land and aligned with more accuracy than guns on a moving ship). It was not until World War I that naval vessels could match the accuracy and firepower of these shore guns. The guns and machinery were removed following the decommissioning of this battery in 1947.


