Inventory of Historic Places in South Carolina

Description: Built in 1878, this one and one-half story eclectic dwelling is of weatherboard under a raised seam, metal, multi-gabled roof. A projecting front gable with cornice returns displays a recessed balcony having corner brackets, pierced balustrade and doorway surrounded by transom and sidelights. The gable overhangs a full width front porch having pierced balustrade and chamfered posts. A central doorway, with sidelights and transom, is flanked by single, shuttered six-over-six windows on the lower front. The recessed gable balcony and ornamented porch are repeated on the left elevation. Pilaster corner posts are paneled. Windows and doors feature triangular caps.

Significance: The Reverend Walter Herbert was one of Leesville's first Methodist ministers. The recessed upper floor balcony appears only twice in the Central Midlands Region, in this house on two elevations and on the facade only on the Pugh-Cooper House (Leesville Institute Historic District, L-12).

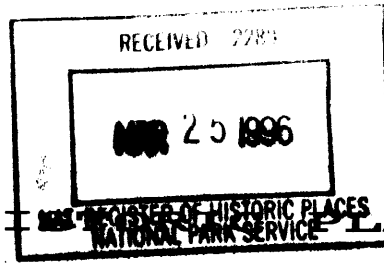

Due to professional error, the Thomas Galbraith Herbert House was incorrectly identified as that of his son, Walter I. Herbert. Family and denomination records show that Walter I. Herbert was never assigned to a church in Leesville and that in any case he would have been fourteen (14) years of age at the time he began living in the house. His father, Thomas Galbraith Herbert, was a retired Methodist minister who purchased or built the house in 1878 and christened it Rest Cottage symbolizing his place of retirement. The family has provided supporting records to this effect.
