Inventory of Historic Places in South Carolina

Description: Executed in the Queen Anne style, this 1910 asymmetrical two story frame residence is distinguished by a right, lower facade bay and a left polygonal, tent roofed turret above a front and left side, wraparound, lower porch. The hipped porch is supported by paired Tuscan colonettes resting on brick pedestals. Molded window caps surmount all sash, which are one-over-one throughout, except for a tripartite tracery window grouping below the pedimented central cross gable. The gabled roof is sheet metal shingles. The house faces a circular drive and is set amid landscaped foundation and side yard plantings. The building has been altered by the application of aluminum siding.

Significance: This house is one of two Queen Anne residences constructed in the town of Batesburg during the early twentieth century. Architecturally, it is an example of a different variation of the Queen Anne style from the Rawl-Couch House, which is a more decorated version. Its builder, J. B. Holman, was a prominent Batesburg businessman.

Acreage: 0.89 acre
